The Economic Development Administration (EDA) has \$3 billion from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) to help communities recover and build more resilient local economies.

The EDA is accepting grant applications for a series of six challenges (see next page) from economic development districts, state and local governments, higher education institutions, nonprofits, unions and tribes.

All projects seeking ARPA funding must describe how the COVID-19 pandemic is impacting their regions and why their project is critical to address those impacts. Additionally, all applicants must align their projects with EDA's investment priorities (see below).

Build Back Better Regional Challenge

Funding available: \$1 billion

Phase 1 deadline: October 19, 2021 (future phases TBD)

Summary: These grants will go to 20-30 regions to grow new regional industry clusters or scale existing sectors through planning, infrastructure, innovation and entrepreneurship, workforce development, access to capital, and more.



Good Jobs Challenge

Funding available: \$500 million

Application deadline: January 26, 2022

Summary: These grants will support the creation and implementation of industry-led training programs, designed to provide skills for and connect unemployed or underemployed workers to existing and emerging job opportunities.



Economic Adjustment Assistance Challenge

Funding available: \$500 million

Suggested application submission date: March 15, 2022 (rolling review)

Summary: This flexible program aims to fund local construction and non-construction projects. Eligible projects include technical, planning, workforce development, entrepreneurship, and public works and infrastructure projects.



Indigenous Communities Challenge

Funding available: \$100 million

Suggested application submission date: March 15, 2022 (rolling review)

Summary: This program for tribal governments and indigenous communities will fund economic development projects, including technical, planning, workforce development, entrepreneurship, and public works and infrastructure projects.



Travel, Tourism & Outdoor Rec. Grants

Funding Available: \$240 million

Suggested application submission date: March 15, 2022

Summary: This funding will assist communities that suffered economic injury because of job losses in travel, tourism, or outdoor recreation sectors.



Statewide Planning, Research & Networks Grants

Funding Available: \$31 million

Suggested application submission date: October 31, 2021

Summary: This funding will be used to invest in economic plans, research to assess the effectiveness of EDA's programs, and support stakeholder communities around key EDA initiatives.
